This has been even more necessary with the unprecedented arrival and devastation of the Covid-19 pandemic. Our staff, volunteers and trustees have been amazing throughout. During this year we received 253 referrals of which—49% came from Health Teams; 12% from Social Care; 18% from Children's Centres; 8% were self-referrals and 13% from other support services

Case study: One volunteer talked about working with a very young mother and an asylum seeker, arriving to the UK seven months pregnant, and overwhelmed. The mother reported to the volunteer that sometimes she "chats" to the baby but felt it was silly. The volunteer was able to inform her that those instincts were completely correct and would support the baby's development. When the volunteer next visited, the mother was sitting reading a book to the baby aloud.

"Mum has started to play with her children instead of forcing them to play (mum realised this and now understands the difference)." coordinator feedback

Publicity for HSB

Home-Start Bristol has a new publicity group made up of trustees, Katherine, Chris and Sarah; advisers, Maroussia, Janet and Celia and our manager Andrea.

One of the main functions of the group is to publicise the volunteer preparation courses, which we run three times a year. These are advertised especially in the local areas where they will be delivered but also publicised online, on our website and on social media (Facebook).

Our volunteers are fundamental to the success of HSB and so it is crucial that we continue to recruit good numbers of volunteers to support our families in need across Bristol and South Gloucestershire. Courses are planned to run in different localities so that potential volunteers can access them easily; however, due to Covid19, our next course, due in September, is being adapted to run online. Details are being made widely available and on the Home-Start Bristol website—please take a look!

HSB's reach area is large and complex and we're aware that we may not be accessing all areas with our publicity, especially on the outer fringes of the city and up into South Gloucestershire. At our Awayday in March we undertook a mapping exercise to identify where our contacts, links and information are thin on the ground and we are gradually building up a picture of how and where we can be more effective.

On top of publicising our courses the PR trustee, supported by the publicity group, generates press releases, editorial for local newsletters, responds to relevant newspaper, TV and radio items and makes contact with local media. The publicity group also organises HSB stands at events, fairs, supermarkets and other community venues in order to raise both vital funding and the profile of Home-Start Bristol.

Home-Start Bristol's Covid-19 Projects

During Lockdown our service has had to adapt and develop alternative ways of being able to support families. We have linked with other agencies and funding streams, such as the John Lewis crisis fund and our own HSUK covid-19 support fund. Staff and volunteers delivered fresh food boxes from Trent's Food & Beverage Hall; they also planted seedlings for families to grow on in their own homes.







This year 2019-2020 we were able to support 157 families—37 of these were supported on a more in-depth 1-1 basis by either our Family Support or Early Intervention Worker

Grants: This was a year in which 2 large grants were due to end – always a worrying prospect! However, a parting gift from our previous manager, Bev, was a successful application to Children in Need for another 3 years of funding - £79,330 in total. During the year we worked hard to build the case for further grants from the National Lottery Community Fund for supporting South Glos families. We were rewarded in December with a promise of £233,980 over the next 5 years. We are so grateful to these funders and to Bristol and South Glos Councils for their continued support. Many thanks too for grants from The Quartet Foundation, The Van Neste Foundation and the Society of Merchant Venturers
